Primitivo:



Zinfandel (also known as Primitivo) is a variety of black-skinned wine grape. The variety is grown in over 10 percent of California vineyards.^[1] DNA analysis has revealed that it is genetically equivalent to the Croatian grapes Crljenak Kaštelanski and Tribidrag, as well as to the Primitivo variety traditionally grown in Apulia, Italy, where it was introduced in the 18th century, and Kratošija in Montenegro and Macedonia.^[2] The grape found its way to the United States in the mid-19th century, where it became known by variations of a name applied to a different grape, likely "Zierfandler" from Austria. The grapes typically produce a robust red wine, although, in the United States, a semi-sweet rosé (blush-style) wine called White Zinfandel has six times the sales of the red wine.^[3] The grape's high sugar content can be fermented into levels of alcohol exceeding 15 percent. The taste of the red wine depends on the ripeness of the grapes from which it is made. Red berry fruit flavors like raspberry predominate in wines from cooler areas, whereas blackberry, anise and pepper notes are more common in wines made in warmer areas^[5] and in wines made from the earlier-ripening Primitivo clone.

Pinot Grigio Delle Venezie:



Pinot Grigio delle Venezie is a white wine grape variety of the species *Vitis vinifera*. Thought to be a mutant clone of the pinot noir variety, it normally has a pinkish-gray hue, accounting for its name, but the colors can vary from blue-gray to pinkish-brown. The word pinot could have been given to it because the grapes grow in small pinecone-shaped clusters. The wines produced from this grape also vary in color from a deep golden yellow to copper and even a light shade of pink,^[1] and it is one of the more popular grapes for skin-contact wine.

Garda Bianco:



The Riviera del Garda Bresciano DOC denomination, together with the Valtenesi DOC and the Garda DOC classic sub-area were aggregated in 2017 to create the Riviera del Garda Classico DOC. Technically, the Riviera del Garda Bresciano DOC was renamed and absorbed the other two. Garda DOC therefore still exists, but without the classic sub-area and the types of wine based on the Gropello grape variety. The production area of Garda DOC wines includes the southern shores of Lake Garda, the largest Italian lake, with a surface area of approximately 370 km². Lake Garda is located between three regions, Lombardy (province of Brescia), Veneto (province of Verona) and Trentino-Alto Adige (province of Trento) and is placed parallel to the Adige, from which it is divided by the mountain massif Bold. To the north it appears narrow like a funnel while to the south it widens, surrounded by

hills, which constitute the production area of the Garda DOC. The cultivation of vines in the Lake Garda area dates back to prehistory. In this area, five thousand years before Christ, man knew wild vines and probably also wine. However, it was the Etruscans, in the 5th century BC, who introduced the cultivation of "domesticated" vines into the Brescia area, replacing the wild ones.

Lugana di Trebbiano:



The Trebbiano di Lugana or turbiana is a white grape variety grown in a small area south of Lake Garda. In this area, between the provinces of Brescia and Verona, the Trebbiano di Lugana has found a perfect habitat, thanks to the almost Mediterranean climate of the southern Garda coast, always mitigated by the gentle breezes of the lake. The lands are of ancient glacial origin, with a flat area formed by deposits of white clays, rich in limestone and minerals and a band of low morainic hills with a very sweet profile. From a genetic point of view, the Trebbiano di Lugana shares DNA with the nearby Trebbiano di Soave and the Verdicchio Marche. They are, in fact, different clones of a single grape variety, which then differentiated over time and which express different wines also in relation to the terroir in which they are grown. Lugana wine is a white with a floral and fruity profile, with good structure and lively acidity. It is a very ductile variety, which allows to produce sparkling wines with the Metodo Classico, still wines, late harvests and passito wines, all of excellent quality. It also has considerable potential for evolution towards tertiary aromas and is one of the Italian whites who is not afraid of the passage of time.

Ripasso della Valpolicella:

Chianti[a] is an Italian red wine produced in the Chianti region of central Tuscany, principally from the Sangiovese grape. It was historically associated with a squat bottle enclosed in a straw basket, called a fiasco ("flask"; pl.: fiaschi). However, the fiasco is now only used by a few makers of the wine; most Chianti is bottled in more standard-shaped wine bottles. Aglianico:



The origins of both the vine itself and its name are unclear. Traditionally, the vine is thought to have originated in Greece, first cultivated by Phocians from an unidentified ancestral vine; it was then brought to Cumae, near modern-day Pozzuoli, by Greek settlers in the 8th century BC, and from there it spread into southern Italy. However, modern DNA analysis of Aglianico does not support this view, revealing little relation to other Greek grape varieties. Its parentage also remains unknown, implying that it is likely to be endemic to its region. If Aglianico was imported to Italy from Greece, no original Greek plantings have persisted. The name first appeared in print as the feminine plural Aglianiche in 1520, and several etymological theories persist. The name may be a corruption of vitis hellenica (Latin for 'Greek vine'), or of Apulianicum, the Latin name for the whole of southern Italy in the time of ancient Rome.^[5] However, since there is also no record of the name Aglianico prior to the fifteenth century Spanish conquest of southern Italy, another possible origin of the name is from llano (Spanish for 'plain') denoting a grape grown on the plains. Ruins from the Greek settlement of Cumae. Oenologist Denis Dubourdieu has said "Aglianico is probably the grape with the longest consumer history of all", claiming that Aglianico was used to make the Falernian wine famed during Roman times.^[6] Along with the white grape Greco (used to make the famous Greco di Tufo wine), the red grape of the region was regarded favourably by Pliny the Elder.^[7] Traces of the vine have been found in Molise, Apulia, and also on the island of Procida near Naples, although it is no longer widely cultivated in those places.
